A Museum patch is available for purchase upon completion of a Scout program. Please call the Museum if you'd like to purchase them for your Scouts.




ABOUT THE MUSEUM

The Elk Grove Historical Museum provides a look at pioneer life from the mid 19th century to early 20th century. The Museum specializes in the history of Elk Grove Village and its development over time.

Our campus includes

- 1856 Schuette-Biermann farmhouse complete with historic furnishings.
- 1880s barn with 19th century farm equipment and tools.
- Orientation Center with temporary exhibits.
- Outbuildings chicken coop, garden, and privy. These outbuildings date to the early 20th century and introduce visitors to structures used for animals and facilities used for daily life.
