NECPA Accreditation verifies and certifies that an early childhood program meets research-based standards of excellence and that it consistently provides high quality care and education. The NECPA designation assists parents in selecting child care by identifying these programs that go above and beyond state requirements and who have a commitment to children's success.

The NECPA program is a rigorous process that measures every area of concern to you and your child. Decades of research has proven that high quality care supports the following:

- Improved language, reading and math capabilities,
- Problem solving and advanced thinking,
- Social-emotional competency and resiliency,
- Memory and motor skills,
- Long-term successes. Children are more likely to;
 - Be healthier adults and report less obesity,
 - Achieve a four-year degree,
 - Become higher-wage earners.

How does a program become accredited?

NECPA gathers detailed information from people who know each program best: the administration, teaching staff and the parents of the children who attend the program. They respond to the questionnaires on over 250 aspects of the program's care, learning, safety and administration. The program's teachers and administrators learn more about what is accepted as the best environment and practices for young children and how to implement and maintain these standards in their classroom. All classrooms are evaluated and all standards must be met in order to achieve NECPA accreditation.

The NECPA's independent professionals visit the site to verify the standards. The resulting in-depth profile of the program's approach and operations is analyzed by NECPA's National Accreditation Council to determine if the program meets our rigorous standards and all applicable governmental regulations. Only then can a program be awarded National Early Childhood Program Accreditation. Once accredited, each center is reviewed annually by NECPA to verify that quality standards are maintained. Programs are also subject to review at any time.
