PUBLIC COMMUNICATION

Resident Crites stated that he did not see a need for Commissioners to have food at meetings. President O'Malley and Commissioner Cooke explained to Resident Crites that food is only present for meetings that start earlier than usual; giving the Commissioners who are coming directly from work an opportunity to eat.

Commissioner Walz brought up correspondence from a resident regarding the softball program utilizing a Square account. Director Sholes explained that transactions go through the Park District's Square account and the monies are deposited into the District's accounts.

DISCUSSION ON FITNESS CENTER

Executive Director Curcio explained that staff assess the Fitness Center's equipment needs annually, using both the 10-Year Capital Replacement Plan and feedback from the Annual Member Survey distributed each November. Occasionally, previously removed equipment may be reinstated—such as the Hammer Strength machines—after receiving member interest.

Director Greene stated that the Fitness Center Staff will be receiving options for uniforms and are currently gathering sizes.

Executive Director Curcio spoke about RecTrac being down. The Staff at the Fitness Center were given the direction to shut down the service every night to see if that will alleviate the problem. Director Greene said that Staff will try that and give it a couple of weeks to see if the situation improves.

Staff will work with Resident Crites to get him survey results for the Fitness Center.

OLD BUSINESS

Commissioner Cooke asked if Marshall Park was going to be open dependent upon the weather and construction. Executive Curcio noted that the park will be open during construction. Marketing will continue to update signage as needed regarding hours of operations, closures, and no camps/buses. Once construction is complete the landscaping in the area between the parking lot and the sidewalk will be addressed. Director Kosbab spoke with the resident who parks his bus in the parking lot and offered the resident alternatives. An extra run of fence that was previously in place behind one of the residences but on Marshall Park property will remain.

NEW BUSINESS

Director Carbon spoke regarding the new design for the park signs that are erected by the roadways. The Capitals project will update signs in six (6) parks.
