APPROVAL OF MINUTES

President O'Malley questioned if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes of the May 8, 2025 Committee of the Whole Meeting and the May 8, 2025 Regular Meeting.

RECOGNITION OF SPECIAL GUESTS

Joe Laudont with Lauterbach & Amen, LLP introduced himself. Mr. Laudont thanked Brad Sholes and staff for working so cooperatively with the audit team. Mr. Laudont proceeded to give an overview of the 2024 audit and its findings. The auditors had an unmodified audit opinion which is the highest level allowed and finds the financial statements are presented true and fair in accordance with financial reporting standards. The district was awarded a GFOA Certificate of Achievement for the 2023 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report and is seeking the award for the 2024 report. This is the 23rd consecutive year that the District has received this distinction. IMRF is currently funded at 102%.

Director Sholes stated that Staff will be coordinating to create a "popular"/user friendly copy of the audit report for the public. This is the first time that the Park District will be creating this document.

Director Greene introduced Jonathan Sebastian, the new Farmhouse Museum Curator. Mr. Sebastian started approximately three (3) weeks ago having previously worked at Arlington Heights, Elmhurst and Benseville/Fisher Farm. The current exhibit highlights pioneers in medicine and is tied into Alexian Brothers Medical Center. Archeology Day, Pioneer Day and the Biergarten are all upcoming events.

PUBLIC COMMUNICATION

Resident Griffin spoke regarding the outdoor Skate Park and how the park is utilized by various ages and skill levels. He urges the Board to continue to have an open mind when considering new ideas as there continues to be populations who are underrepresented in park district programming.

President O'Malley commented that the Skate Park cost roughly \$400K and that it's great to see so many people using it. Commissioner Walz added that he, along with former Director Tammy Miller, attended a class at a conference where they learned about outdoor skate parks. The park garners the least amount of resident phone calls. Commissioner Cooke stated that Board members and Staff attend State and National recreation conferences to hear about the latest trends and innovative ideas. President O'Malley expressed that Staff have done a tremendous job expanding amenities and moving away from small playgrounds for residents. President O'Malley hopes the Park District will continue to be visionary.

Resident Burns requested that a bike race return to Elk Grove. Mr. Burns also stated that Elk Grove Travel is down two (2) members for the last year and wants the board to have five (5) or (6) filled positions. Resident Burns is also concerned about spiritwear for the softball program and for what he sees as a lack of parameters for designs.

President O'Malley replied that the Travel Baseball Board has been looking for volunteers but has not had any additional volunteers step forward. Volunteers do not have to be involved in baseball or have a child registered for the program. Superintendent Sieder stated that people interested can either contact him or find the volunteer form on the website. Superintendent Sieder also stated that all spiritwear designs are approved by that sport's advisory board.
