CAPITAL PROJECTS

Commissioner O'Malley had no report.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

Commissioner Walz gave the following Finance Committee report:

Corporate Fund

- ➤ Around \$2.1 million in property tax, and around \$225,000 in replacement tax were collected in March.
- > All expense categories are under budget.
- > Year to date total is \$2,476,000 compared to a budget of \$1,809,000.

Recreation Fund

- > \$1,000,000 dollars in property tax was collected in March.
- > Fees & Admissions were at \$208,000 compared to a budget of \$236,000.
- ➤ Program fees were \$464,000 compared to a budget of \$425,000.
- ➤ All expense categories are under budget.
- ➤ Net revenue was \$895,000 compared to a budget of \$569,000.

Golf Fund

- > 597 rounds of golf were played in March. The Driving Range was open a few days in March as well.
- > Fees & Admissions were \$84,000 compared to a budget of \$63,000.
- ➤ All expense categories are at or under budget year to date except for supplies and utilities.
- \rightarrow Net revenue is \$(104,000) compared to a budget of \$(236,000).

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

President Cooke shared at tonight's meeting there was discussion on the Fox Run Fence Project, Rotary Park, the 401(a) Restatement, and correspondence received from a landscaper that recently submitted a bid. President Cooke will reach out to this individual. There was also a discussion on a potential Parks Foundation fundraiser. Commissioner O'Malley added that the Board also gave a consensus to break the lease with ComEd for Muir Park.

ATHLETICS COMMITTEE

Commissioner Biedke gave the following update:

- ➤ House Softball has 204 girls enrolled for the spring season.
- > Travel Baseball has begun its season.
- ➤ House Baseball has 232 total registered for levels Peewee through Pony.
- ➤ Football has 4 teams in each of the levels of grades 3-5 and grade 6-8 leagues.
- > Spring Cheer ends the last weekend of April with a competition.
- > Spring Recreational Soccer began its season with 267 players and Travel Soccer has started its spring season as well.

GOLF COURSE COMMITTEE

Commissioner Carlson welcomed new General Manager, Alex Chapple and new Bar & Events Manager, Kelly Cunningham. Commissioner Carlson said the Miller Shoot-Out will be held on May 13.

YOUTH COMMITTEE

Commissioner Carlson said the deadline for the Youth Scholarships is May 6. Applications can be found on our website as well as at the Hattendorf and Pavilion Customer Service desks. Commissioner Carlson also gave the dates for the Teen Summer Blast pool parties. They are July 15th and August 5th.

ADULT CENTER COMMITTEE

President Cooke said the Spring Bizzare is taking place today and tomorrow from 9am-noon. Other upcoming events include Rotary Club Lunch on May 12, A Day at the Races on May 18, and Dancing with the Band starts up on May 5. President Cooke stated the Buzz newsletter is a great place to see upcoming events and trips.

NEW BUSINESS

Commissioner Walz stated he went to Diane Malinowski's retirement party this afternoon. He congratulated her on her retirement saying she did so much for the District. President Cooke added that Diane donated her time as the Secretary of the Parks Foundation and said that she was one of the few original members of the Foundation.

In honor of Arbor Day, Director Carbon read the Arbor Day Proclamation from Mayor Johnson, and Director Sholes shared that a tree will be planted at Mead Park on Friday morning. This event will be streamed on Facebook.

PAYMENT OF BILLS

Commissioner O'Malley moved to authorize Director Curcio to make payment of the bills in the amount of 120,824.57 P-cards for April 11, 2022, \$113,996.51 for April 14, 2022 and \$173,870.14 for April 22, 2022.
